GIRLS WRESTLING BATTLES AT HOME INVITE

The Wahoo girls wrestling team competed Friday, December 19, at their home invitational, gaining valuable mat time and showing continued growth across the lineup. While the team finished 11th overall in a deep, competitive field, several wrestlers delivered strong performances and quality wins throughout the day.

"Our team wrestled really well," coach Ed Raney noted. "Our more experienced girls really put it together, with Kinzley, Emma, Liv, and Brianna all placing in the top five, and a number of other girls picking up quality wins." Brianna Marshall earned a 5th-place finish at 100 lbs, Kinzley Beavers placed 3rd and Emma Jones took 4th at 140 lbs, while Livia Sharpe added another 5th-place finish at 155 lbs.

Freshmen Kinzley Beavers and Emma Jones continue to impress early in the season, combining for a 16–5 record to start the year—one of those losses coming against each other. "They've really hit the ground running," Ed Raney shared. "We're excited to see what they can do once they settle into their weights after the break."

The growth of the program was also evident from newer wrestlers. Holly Buckmaster picked up multiple wins and narrowly missed a top-six finish, while first-year wrestlers Adyson Kadlec and Norah Herrera both earned quality victories, showing clear progress each time they step on the mat.

Overall, the invite showcased the depth, resilience, and upward momentum of the girls program as they continue building confidence and experience moving forward.

HOME MAT GRIT: WARRIORS BATTLE TO 4TH AT WAHOO INVITE

The boys wrestling team turned in a strong, gritty performance at their home invitational on Saturday, December 20, finishing 4th overall in a deep and competitive field. Throughout the day, the Warriors consistently won tight matches and showed growth across the lineup, especially from younger wrestlers stepping into bigger roles.

Coach Hodges was pleased with the effort and toughness shown on the mat, saying, "The guys battled hard and won tons of close matches. We are seeing several young wrestlers step up and perform at a high level against tough upperclassmen." That competitiveness paid off with multiple podium finishes, highlighted by Grady Meyer's championship run at 175 lbs, where he went undefeated on the day and controlled every match.

Several wrestlers earned third-place finishes, including Grayson Styskal (126), Gavin Sutton (132), Zane Wesely (144), and Braydon Fittro (165), each stringing together impressive wins in the consolation rounds. The lineup depth and fight were evident from start to finish, with athletes finding ways to score bonus points and swing close team battles in Wahoo's favor.

With momentum building, the focus now shifts to one final dual before the break. As Coach Hodges added, "I'm looking forward to one last dual with Seward before we head into break for some much-needed rest." The showing at the home invite reinforced that this group is trending upward and laying a strong foundation for the rest of the season.












MIDDLE SCHOOL GIRLS
